

The Rotary Adventures in Human Rights program is a collaborative effort with the Canadian Museum for Human Rights. The program runs annually from a Sunday evening until Friday evening during the third week of August. The target group will be a maximum of 24 high school students entering grades 11 and 12 in September of that year.

The mandate and goal of the program is to provide students with an opportunity to explore human rights issues within the Canadian Museum for Human Rights by focusing on themes such as: Women's Rights, Indigenous' Rights and Democratic Rights. Themes will change over the years in order to remain relevant to the dominant issues of the time.

Although the majority of the program will be held at the Museum there will be visits to various non-governmental organizations and Winnipeg locations in order to see positive action in progress in the area of human rights.

At the end of the program, students will have an opportunity to design an action plan that they could implement within their schools. With their new found insights and knowledge in human rights and peace, students will see the value in continuing their peace journey by registering for the University of Winnipeg Global College course in future years.
